

B.S. in Business Management [formerly BMF – Business, Management and Finance]

BM DEGREE REQUIREMENTS CHECK LIST (16 COURSES)

(Effective Sept. 2016)

Note: Starting Fall 2014, “Strategic Human Resource Management” (BUSN 3240) is no longer a requirement for the BM major. Also, all majors must take PHIL 3314. Three Business Electives are required.

To Accounting majors: Please note that if you wish to double major in Business Management and Accounting, you will only need to take 5 additional courses: Use the checklists for the two majors to see which courses to take.

To Business Management majors: Please note that if you wish to double major in BMF and Accounting (Internal Accounting Track; code = 004), you will only need to take seven additional courses. For the CPA track (Code=003), you will need about 10 additional courses. To see what you need, get the two checklists. We also offer a 150-credit combined major.

(A) Business Core (12 COURSES)

_____ ACCT 2001 --Introductory Accounting (no prerequisite)

_____ ECON/BUSN 2100 -- Elementary Macroeconomics (prereq is Core Math or Sophomore Status)

_____ ECON/BUSN 2200 -- Elementary Microeconomics (prereq is Core Math or Sophomore Status)

_____ CISC 1050 OR CISC 1110--Intro to Computer Applications or Programming Using C++

(if you are double majoring in BMF and ACCT, take CISC 1050. CISC 1110 is for students interested in programming)

_____ BUSN/ECON 3400 (Business/Economic Statistics) (prereq is Core Math or Sophomore Status)

OR MATH 2501 OR MATH 3501 (these are only for students who have taken a year of calculus)
OR PSYC 3400

_____ ECON/BUSN 3410 (microeconomics prerequisite; this will not be waived) OR

MATH 1201--Fundamentals of Mathematical Economics

_____ BUSN 3100 -- Principles of Marketing (no prerequisite)

_____ BUSN 3200 -- Principles of Management (no prerequisite)

_____ ACCT 3201 -- Business Law I (no prerequisite)

_____ FINC [BUSN] 3310 -- Corporation Financial Management (ACCT 2001 prereq)

_____ BUSN 3430 /CISC 2531-- Operations Management (statistics prerequisite; also, take CISC 1050 first). You must take the stat. course first!!!

(B) Business Electives (3 Courses)

Three additional electives in business not used to satisfy the Business Core or Capstone Seminar requirement.

To satisfy this requirement, students may take:

(a) any three courses with a business prefix including internships.

(b) one or two courses with a different prefix if cross-listed with a business course; for example, CISC 1590 which is cross-listed with BUSN 3420.

(c) The following courses may also be used to satisfy the business electives requirement: ACCT 3001, 3041, 3051, 3101, 4201, CISC 3820, ECON 3202, 3342, 3352, 3362, MATH 2601, PSYC 3171.

What we suggest you take to satisfy this requirement is three courses in an area that interests you. For example, if you are interested in finance, take three advanced finance classes, if you are interested in marketing, take three advanced marketing classes, etc. Internships are another possibility. If you are interested in an internship, please go to the Magner Center.

(C) Capstone Seminar (1 Course) One of the following seminars (they are writing-intensive): Seminars are for graduating seniors only. BMF majors may take any seminar—4000W, 4100W, 4101W, 4200W, 4202W, FINC [BUSN] 4300W, etc. Find one that is open. We will not overtally you into one that is closed. You may take any of these seminars. _____BUSN 4000W -Special Topics in Business; OR BUSN 4100W- Seminar in Marketing Research; OR BUSN 4101W-Seminar in Marketing Management; OR 4200W- Seminar in Business Management and Policy; OR BUSN 4202W/CISC 1580W -Seminar in Computer-Assisted Management Games; OR FINC [BUSN] 4300W-Seminar in Business Finance

Minors you may wish to consider (see Department for brochure). These minors are open to all majors, including BMF majors:

(a) accounting (002); (b) consumer behavior (063); (c) economics (036); (d) human resource development and management (064); (e) human resource management and diversity studies (069); (f) small business management and urban entrepreneurship (095); (g) financial planning; (h) marketing (034) It is not for BBA students concentrating in marketing; (i) business law (039); (j) corporate social responsibility; or (k) organization behavior.

Accounting, Business, or economics majors are not eligible for the minor in finance (037).
